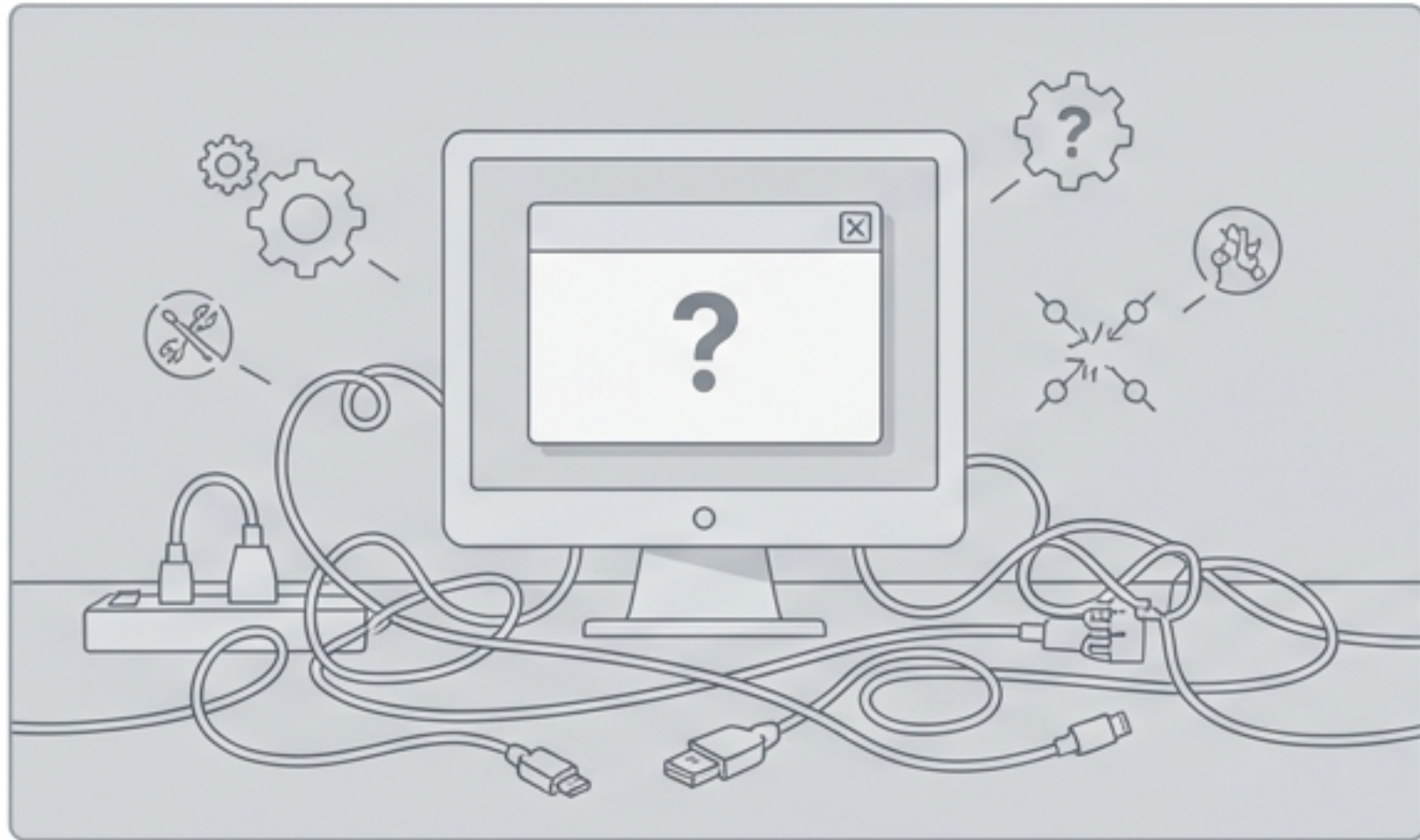

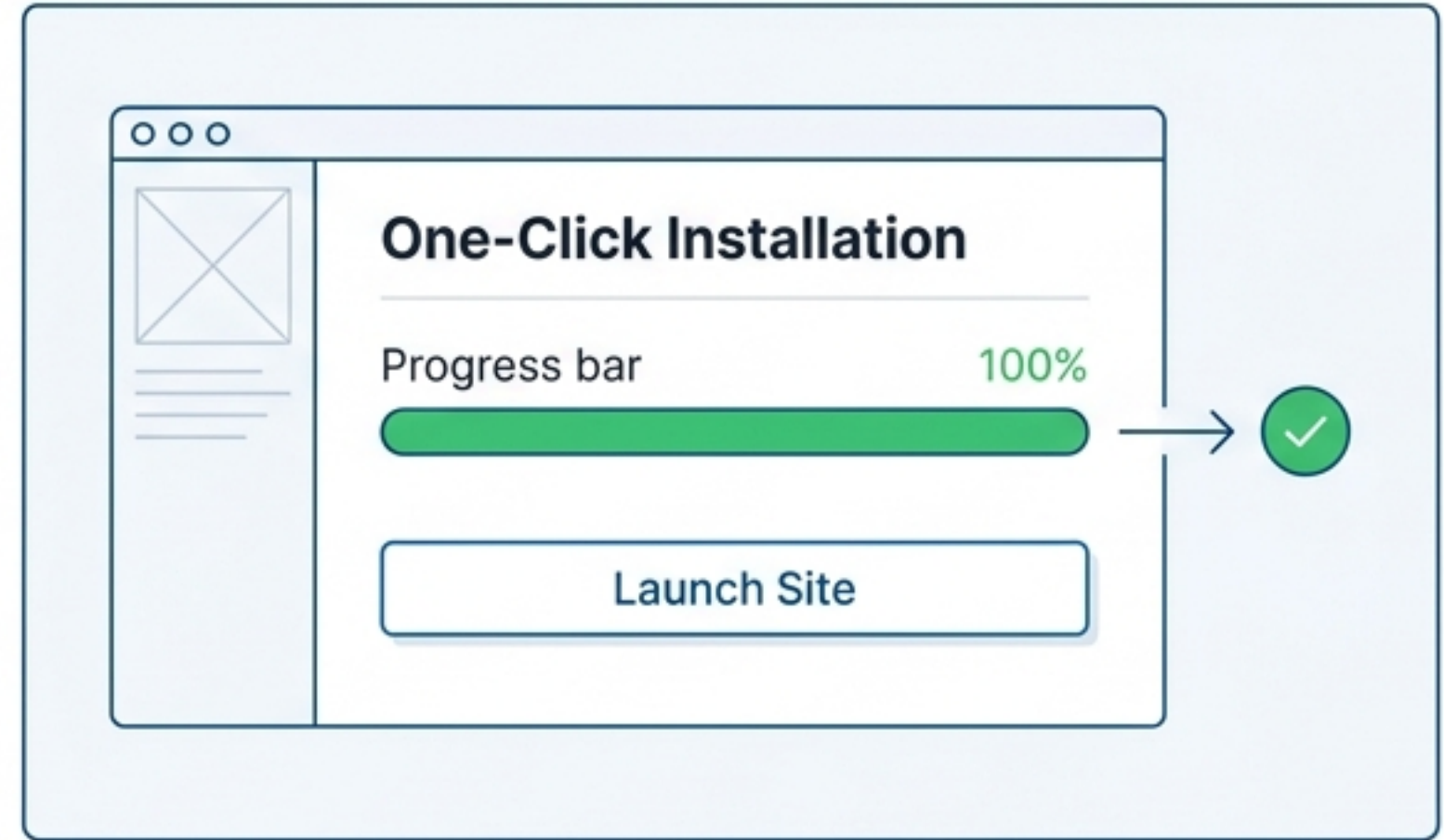



Secure These Three Foundations Before You Start



1. A Domain Name

Your site's address (e.g., yoursite.com). Purchase through a registrar like Namecheap or bundle with hosting.



2. A Hosting Provider

The physical server space where your website's files will actually live.



3. Fifteen Minutes

Uninterrupted time. Seriously, that's often all it takes to complete the setup.

Choose Your Blueprint: Three Paths to Installation


Start Node
What is your primary goal?

Method 1: One-Click Install
(Recommended for Beginners).



Available through most hosts. No technical knowledge required. Your site is live in minutes.

Method 2: Manual "5-Minute" Install.



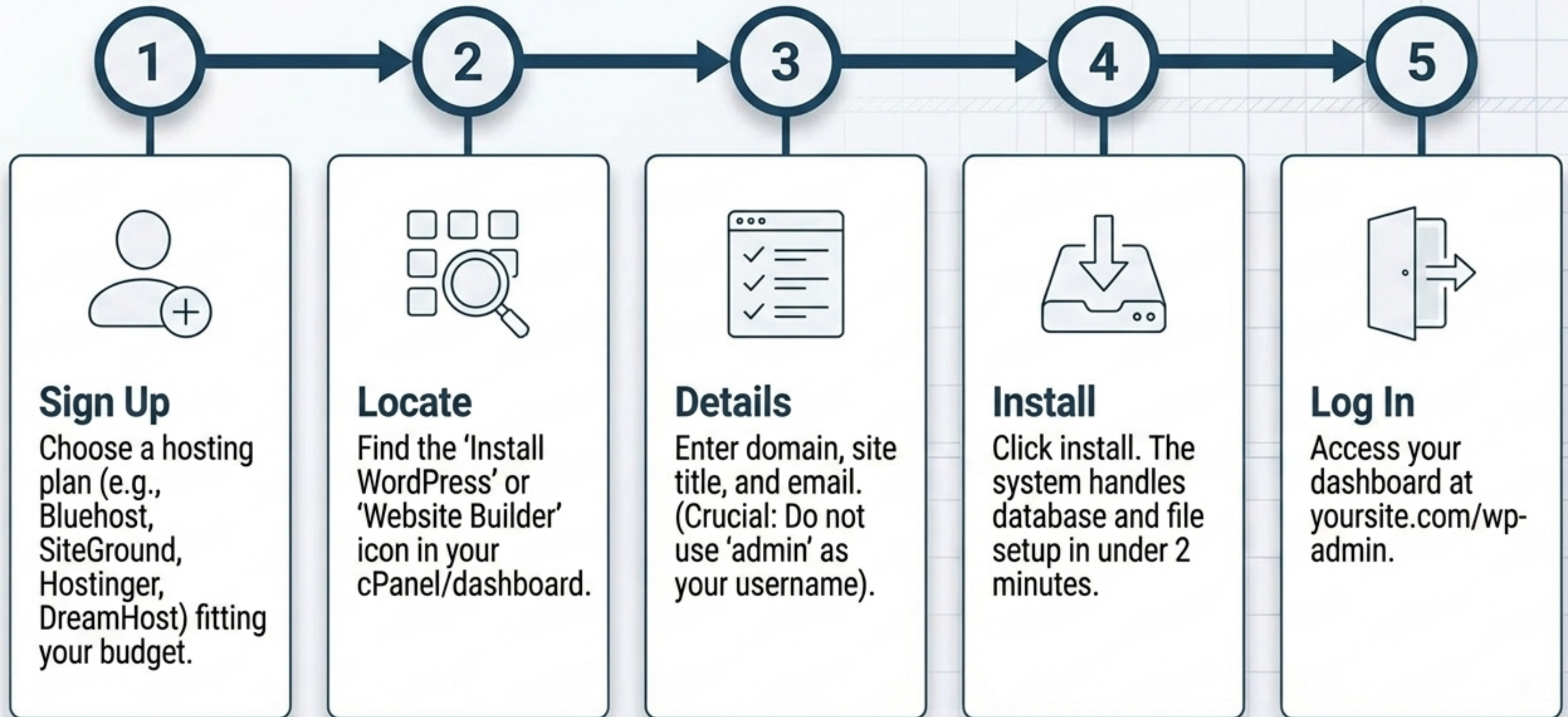
Download WordPress, upload via FTP/SFTP, and create a database. For power users.

Method 3: Local Sandbox Installation.



Use tools like Local WP or XAMPP. Develop and test on your computer before going live.

Method 2, Phase 1: Server Preparation (Manual Install)



Step 1: Download.

Grab the latest core files (.zip) directly from WordPress.org.



Step 2: Database.

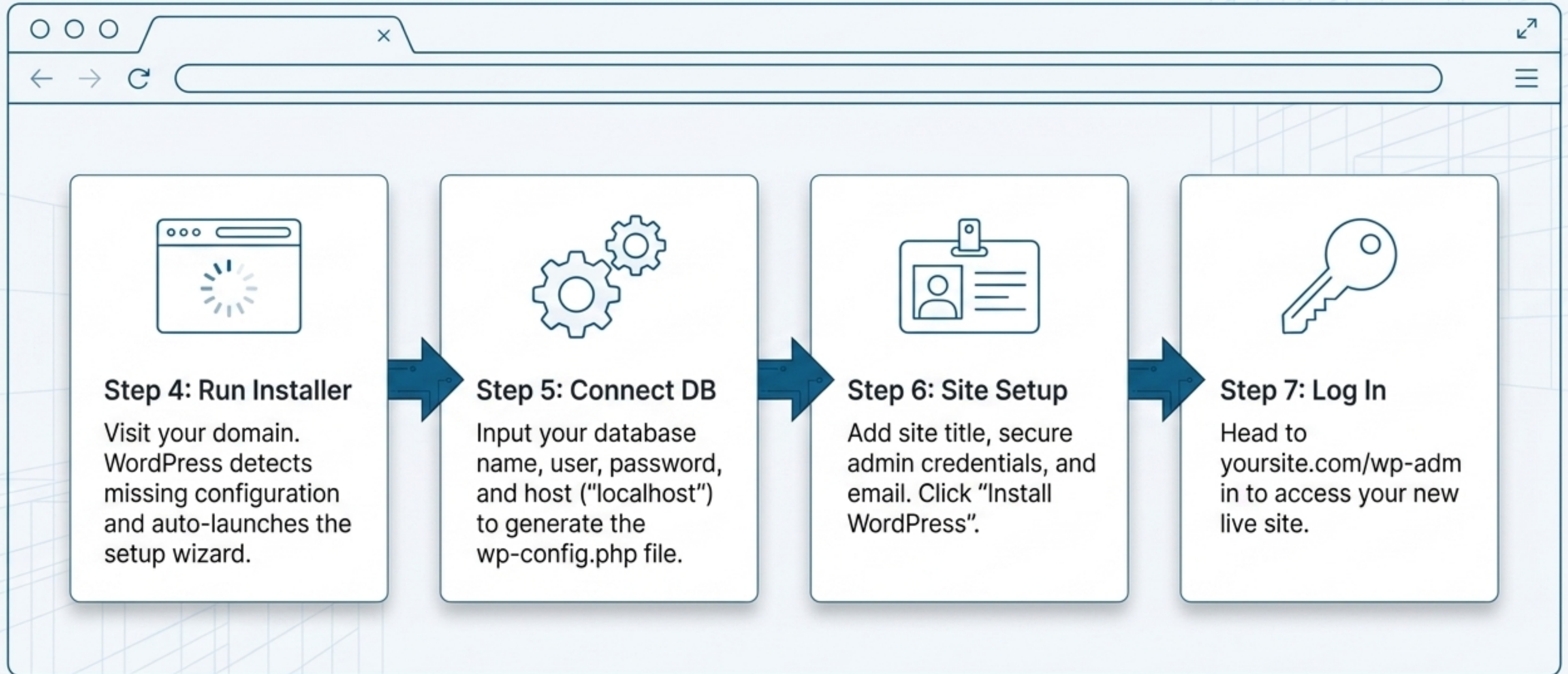
Log into your host cPanel. Create a new MySQL database and a database user. Record the credentials.



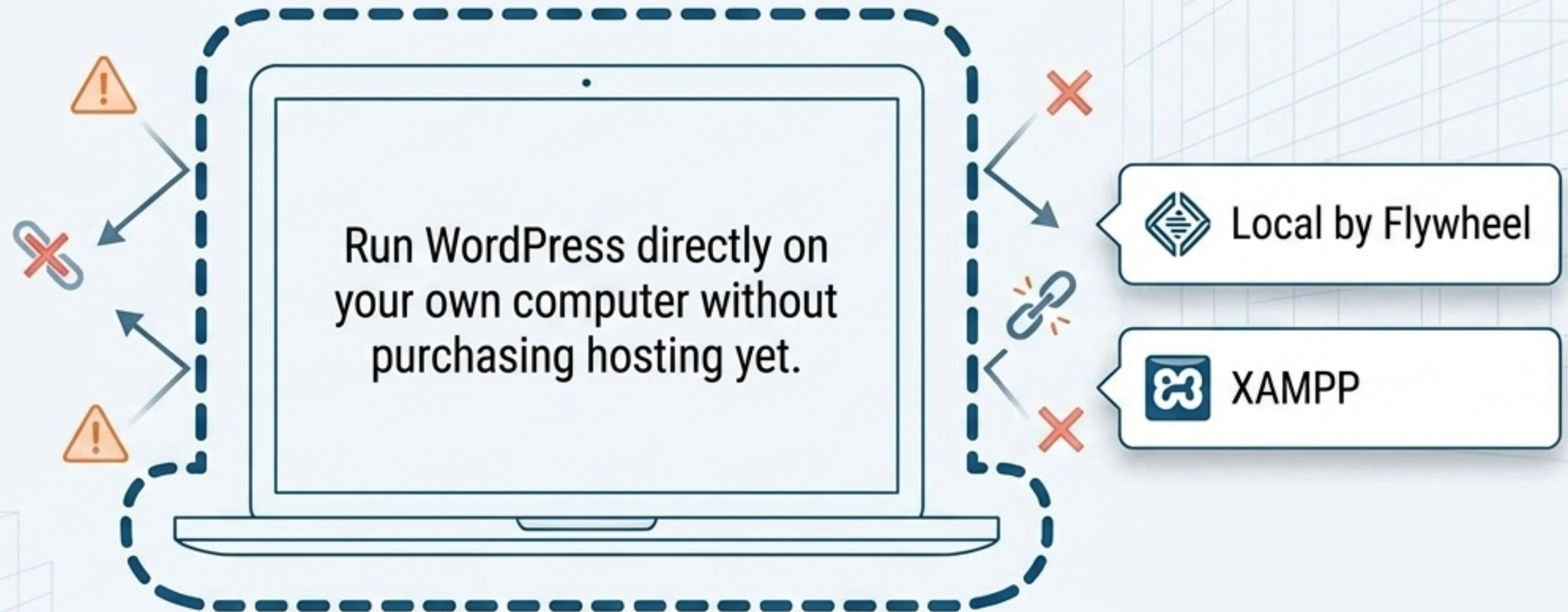
Step 3: FTP Upload.

Use FileZilla (or host file manager) to extract and upload files to your server's public directory (public_html/www).

Method 3: The Offline Sandbox for Safe Experimentation



The 'Why': Perfect for deciding on themes, testing risky plugin updates, and building offline to avoid embarrassing 'site down' moments on live client projects.

Day 1: The Immediate Launch Checklist

- ✓ **Clean House:** Delete the default 'Hello World' post and 'Sample Page'.
- ✓ **Dress the Site:** Choose and activate a theme tailored to your site's exact purpose.
- ✓ **Install Core Plugins:** Add essential tools for SEO (Yoast or Rank Math), security, and caching.
- ✓ **Identity Check:** Lock in your exact Site Title and Tagline under Settings → General.
- ✓ **Build the Skeleton:** Publish your core structural pages: Home, About, and Contact.

The Guardrails: Four Traps to Avoid on Day One



Skipping Backups

Install a plugin like UpdraftPlus before you make sweeping changes, not after.



Weak Credentials

The single biggest security gap. Never use 'admin' as your username.



Ugly URLs

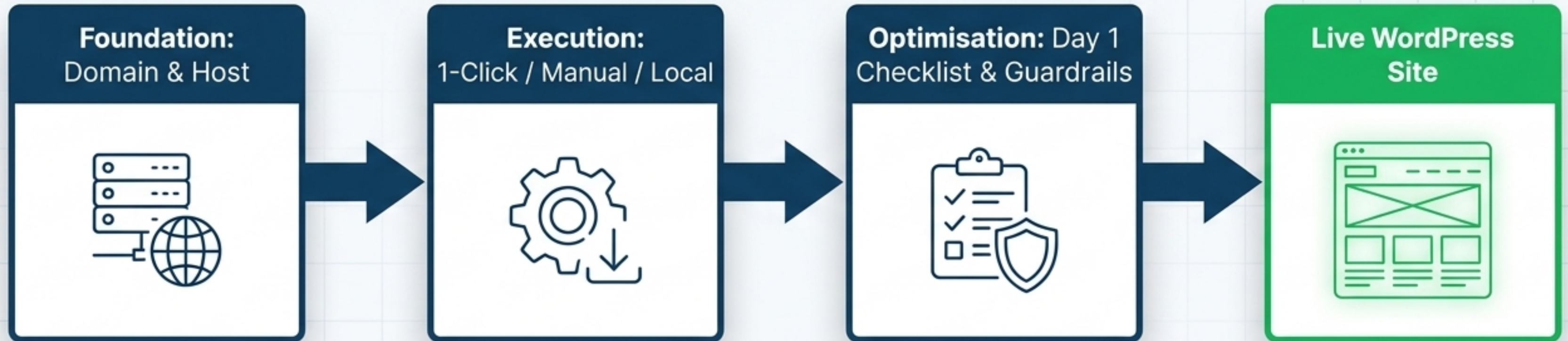
Immediately go to Settings → Permalinks and switch to 'Post name' for SEO-friendly links.



Unsecured Connections

Ensure your free Let's Encrypt SSL certificate is active through your host before launching.

The Blueprint Realised: From Blank Screen to Live Site



The trick isn't technical skill; it's simply knowing which button to click and in what order. The learning curve for content and design from here is far gentler than the installation ever was. Spin up your site today.
